4 OPENING PLENARY SESSION

Christian Baden, Chair

Working Group 1 Theory

- Rethinking public opinion studies in the digital era: Expert discourse on the theoretical and methodological challenges of public opinion research - *Agnieszka Stepinska*
Collaborative project with 13 authors from the network, documenting challenges widely perceived among researchers and practitioners across countries
The paper just got published in IJPOR: <https://doi.org/10.1093/ijpor/edag001>
- Polarisation and stance-taking across platforms: Challenges of stance annotation in trans-related debates - *Elena Negrea Busuioc*
Collaborative project with 7 authors from the network, investigating public responses to UK PM Sunak's comments on misgendering
- Public opinion negotiations in a digital media ecosystem: A conceptual framework - *Christian Baden*
Collaborative project with 10 authors from the network, proposing 5 key conceptual lenses for conceptualizing public opinion discourse on digital media.

Working Group 2 Tools

6 WORKING GROUP SESSIONS: WG2 TOOLS

Johannes B. Gruber, Chair

Status of Deliverables

We are now working on all deliverables in parallel:

- 2.1 (Inventory of existing tools): we extended the inventory of opinion measurement tools on meteor and worked on the draft for a publication on tools in the field of opinion mining. We solved some issues with plots and tables, bringing us closer to the final draft.
- 2.2 (Joint publication on strategies and recommendations for the automated extraction of textually expressed opinions): as new people joined the WG and wanted to contribute to the paper, there was a round of reviews and discussions of the current state of the draft. This led to some reorganization of the paper and a new framing was discussed.
- 2.3 (Online teaching material): All teaching materials WG2 has produced for the WG4 organised training schools are now online at <https://github.com/Opinion-CA21129/learning-materials/>. The deliverable is done.

Progress at the meeting

After an update from Johannes on the ongoing tasks and the Deliverables, we talked about the results of the brainstorming session in Kraków. Both the possibility to work on funding applications and start a paper about “LLM assisted systematic literature reviews” were received positively by those not present at the last WG meeting. However, most people in the core group are already deeply involved in ongoing projects and from the newcomers, nobody emerged as a leader of these new endeavors. We decided to focus on complete ongoing tasks.

- The remaining time was spent working on four tasks in smaller groups:
- Johannes, Christina, Aleksandra and Bruno worked on pushing the draft for our systematic literature review further
- Peter, Olga, Wendo, Kasper, and Jelena worked on the draft of the D2.2 paper.
- Roksana, Kinga, Julia and Olga worked on systematising our tool collection further and adding it to Meteor.

Owing to the WG3 Vice Chair's last-minute cancellation of her participation in the meeting, no WG3 sessions took place.

8 WORKING GROUP SESSIONS: WG4 INCLUSION & DISSEMINATION

Carlos Arcila Calderon, Chair

Balance of WG4 activities:

- Malaga WG4 meeting: Productive meeting leading to an output: “Proposal for an ethical framework for the use of LLMs in text analysis”. Still more work is needed, but variables and first analyses are ready.
- Another in-progress paper: Presented in the morning: “Adoption of computational methods by European opinion researchers”.
- Other publications: Article in The Conversation, note on the webpage about the glossary, three publications from Ema in connection to Opinion, and some others mentioned by Eda and Ljubisa (2 submitted and 1 in progress; presented in the morning); those that are published will be sent so that they can be included in the website.
- Current state of Podcasts: (<https://aboutccs.net/opinion/>). Eight episodes have already been published, featuring members of Opinion, and work so far has been very positive.
- Current state of LinkedIn: Page was created and a publication strategy was created, but no content was added. Members will be invited, and the profile will be updated, so that it remains at least as a point of contact to the network.
- Current state of the GitHub repository: It was created, including materials from COpA I and II, although open to other outputs from other WGs (mainly WG2). COpA III will be also added.

WG4 Deliverable to write

- D4.3. Joint white paper on practice-based recommendations for inclusion in computational methods training and collaborative textual research. Work has started, and recommendations based on COpA-related experiences will be used, together with some of the findings of papers and discussions in the context of the WG, and some of the results of the surveys (pre and post) COpA I.
- A new survey for the whole consortium will be developed (a few questions about self-perceptions on recommendations, how you feel you have improved over the consortium, balance of the work over these years). It will be distributed in Zagreb to get input from all participants.
- The paper will be almost ready by the Working Group Meeting in Zagreb. There we will produce the final recommendations, adding some testimonials (by

interviewing some trainers and attendees of different COpA's) to have a more engaging approach, and the findings of the survey.

Planning of COpA 2026

- Fine-tuning current proposal and preliminary discussion about potential teachers. A content proposal is ready (see attached) and the suggested names will be contacted by WG4.

Future activities

- Online and in-person masterclasses are discussed.

9 PLANNING PLENARY

Christian Baden, Chair

The remaining tasks to be organized within the network require a cross-WG approach. Notably, the following items require attention:

- **The Birmingham Preconference**

We have received 13 paper submissions thereof 6 for the Works in Progress session and 7 for the Future Research session. The CG will decide how to proceed and design a program

The local host Regina Seiwald has almost completed preparations, so we should be set.

- **Final Conference Zagreb**

The current direction is to have a large conference with Day 1 dedicated to within-network wrapping up, and Day 2 dedicated to outreach and impact toward the stakeholder community

- **COpA III Training School Zagreb** – *Carlos Arcila Calderon & David Blanco Herrero*

WG4 presents plans for the final official round of the Training school, which build upon and synthesize experiences from the previous two rounds.

- **Science Communication, Stakeholder Engagement, Training Materials**

Many outcomes from the network need to be made useful, visible and accessible to relevant stakeholder communities.

OPINION's Podcast series is up and running – *Wendo King'ang'i*

- **Lifeline for the OPINION community**

The primary means for extending the community's lifeline is our effort to integrate members into CompText; but there is a need for additional initiatives to carry on the network's initiatives beyond the funding deadline.

The plenary forms three Task Forces dedicated to planning the final conference (Zagreb), utilizing outcomes (Outreach), and sustaining the network (Lifeline).

10 TASK FORCE SESSIONS: ZAGREB TASK FORCE

Christian Baden, Rapporteur

Participants: *Christian Baden, Jelena Gledic, Tamara Kunic, Artur Lipinski, Peter Maurer, Larisa Mistrean*

The task force dedicated to planning the final conference in Zagreb has proposed the following rough structure for the meeting:

Day 1 will be focused on wrapping up activities within the network, whereas Day 2 will be focused on generating outreach and impact beyond the network. We will invite up to 60-65 members of the network (including invited non-member speakers), but enable up to 30 additional participants to register participation and attend at their own expenses (the cap is due to the room capacity at VERN University in Zagreb).

For **Day 1**, we anticipate the following:

- one or two sessions in a microconference format, presenting the latest scientific outcomes of the network's activities
- one plenary session for distilling key learnings and identifying collective agenda items based on four years of network activities (in an inclusive, interactive format, using digital tools to enable everyone to contribute)
- one session dedicated to discussing grant applications and project plans that are emerging from the network, including matchmaking and workshopping strategies; the anticipated format includes brief project pitches, followed by Q&A, followed by breakout group discussions among individuals interested in specific initiatives

For **Day 2**, we propose the following:

- one session of outcome presentations focused on new data, conclusions and insights that arise from empirical studies conducted by the network, reframed for public accessibility
- one session focused on learnings in a prescriptive sense, recommendations for concepts, techniques, ethics and resources in the study of opinionated communication.
- two roundtable discussions (half internal, half external participants; tentatively, focused on toxic opinion expression and ways of identifying and managing it; and on polarized or contested public opinion corridors and their impact on political discourse and democratic society; see below)

- additional outcomes of the network will be presented as posters, framed in a perspective relevant and accessible to the public.

For this purpose, we will invite external stakeholders in three primary circles:

- 1) a handful of high-profile individuals who will participate in roundtable discussions
- 2) a selection of (mostly regional) key stakeholders for on-site participation
- 3) a wide audience of stakeholders across and beyond Europe to join the event online

For the roundtables, we suggest the following framing & composition:

Roundtable 1: Hostile Opinions: Managing Public Discourse in the Face of Aggressive Contestation

Participants could be:

- (internal) a study on hostility in opinion expression (e.g., Jurate & coauthors)
- (internal) a tools perspective on detecting/classifying hostility (incivility, intolerance)
- (internal) an ethics perspective on processing personal opinion expression
- (external) a public communication practitioner (e.g., journalist) acutely exposed to hostile opinion expression
- (external) an editor/site manager involved in moderation/management of opinion expression
- (external) a regulator focused on processing toxic participation
- (external) activists involved in supporting harassed public speakers (e.g., R. Tromble)

Roundtable 2: Battleground Public Opinion: Can we be polarized and mainstreamed at once?

Participants could be:

- (internal) a study on conceptual approaches to studying public opinion processes (e.g., Christian & coauthors)
- (internal) a study on tracking the distributions (and even better, policing) of public opinion at scale
- (internal) ...
- (external): a decision maker that collided with mobilized public opinion
- (external): a mediator engaged in enabling constructive exchanges across camps

11 TASK FORCE SESSIONS: OUTREACH TASK FORCE

David Blanco Herrero, Rapporteur

Overall strategy for outreach: Active outreach after Opinion is over is not guaranteed, and mostly based on individual efforts and interests. However, most assets will remain available (at least for a period of years), so making them available and known while the network remains active is central. This way, even after Opinion's funding is over, people can still access and find the website, GitHub repository, podcasts, publications, etc.

12 TASK FORCE SESSIONS: LIFELINE TASK FORCE

Asta Zelenkauskaite, Rapporteur

Participants: *13 members*

During the meeting all the participating members have been invited to provide their own "wish list".

Summarized thematic clusters as follows:

I. Ad hoc tasks

Maintaining Network was the first emergence cluster that many participants have identified. The following needs have been identified:

1. Helping to create a better “keeping in touch efforts” after the network will complete the formal activities. Some of the needs that have been identified were the need for sustainable resources for communication (where *Kasper* proposed existing tools or simple tools such as mailing list (with a capacity to subscribe to digest or LinkedIn).
2. Continuing for the network to serve as a space for different members to “match” for the projects. One of the expressed idea was taking advantage of interdisciplinary “experiment” that this network created and add to the web page an easy-to-use Match-making platform (with the specific skillsets); lists of publications—e.g., a table of everyone’s expertise and keep it public so that everyone can access it when they need a partner.
3. Providing infrastructure preservation archiving efforts what we do or we have done so far (people in the room were comfortable to say that we have people interested and having a know-how capacity to implement this effort).

When it comes to keeping in touch, there was an invitation to searching for Alternative communication tools: Communication channel (not SLACK): tool (post-network efforts continuity) and provide: Infrastructure preservation: (archival efforts), adaptation to specific domains capacity to reactivate network of scholars and provide inclusion capacity: Offering a Hub in Central Europe (different universities network) to disseminate/train/engage, provide resources and space (virtual/physical space), capacity of reactivate the network for collaboration and expanding visibility of achievements. Share information about existing “freelist”. Not to shut it down. Ask about the rules “when and how to use” resources: organize (e.g., a conference), hiring options.

II. Long term goals

Goals included interest in seeking joined funding, providing resources, ideas, grouping people based on topics. There were two strands of conversation:

1. Seeking joined funding opportunities for topic specific issues:
Recreating network based on specific topics (political communication/LLMs/LLMs and architectures)
 - a. Some participants shared a range of possible places to start (e.g., Central Europe network; organizing workshops: COpA) *Carlos Arcila Calderon*
2. Join existing networks at COST.

III. New topic-related interests.

Other conversations were around applying for another COST through new topics for the proposal: focus on larger network options (expansion ideas e.g., include new universities and broader network): political communication, LLMs, regional networks.

New topics that the members expressed for the network possibility through Political communication: monitoring political actors and the need to use tools (Meta analysis of the network of we do).

Topic specific group: LLMs and recent advancements and connecting with scholars who are interested e.g., architectures. When it comes to topics, identify new unifying topics for the network (e.g., LLMs), e.g., LLMs (method and issues); LLM-based benchmarking/simulations, analysis

Interest was expressed in preserving availability of the resources that are offered by the network (e.g., by specific regional scholars, e.g., Albanian/Balkan and other area scholars).
