4 OPENING PLENARY SESSION

Christian Baden, Chair

- The network has at this point 184 members from 40 countries, roughly half of these from Inclusion Target Countries, almost two thirds female, more than 40% Early Career Scholars (defined by COST as under the age of 40). Of these, 55 were invited to attend the Limassol Working Group Meeting, and 46 were actually present, representing a total of 29 countries. We had several last minute cancellations due to health issues and canceled flights.
- There is a first formal publication that arises from the OPINION Network: Lewandowska, B., Liebeskind, C., Baczowska, A., Ruzaitė, J., Dylgieri, A., Kazazi, L. & Lombart, E. (2023). Opinion events: Types and opinion markers in English social media discourse. *Lodz Papers in Pragmatics*.
- OPINION's first round of deliverables are due in April, one from each WG.

Day 1 - 18.01.2024

- Lit review already has a narrative form. Some topics not as relevant. Some of the initial texts written are preserved for future use or in textboxes.
- Glossary - not all items fully developed yet.

Gabriella Szabo & Lenka Vochocová - Political & Cultural Communication Subgroup

- Structure of each item: Definitions, general features, the role in opinion formation, the role in opinion manifestation, measurement related issues, references; anything else?
- We need to decide: formats, deadlines, final destination of the documents, etc.

- Glossary more advanced
- Lit review - still in progress; needs editing and structuring

Discussion about decisions on deliverables

Final draft of the Lit review:

1. Two purposes:
 - a. report to COST
 - b. publications: Book – someone needs to be in charge as first editor (and/or co-editors) – to propose a structure, templates, etc. – please volunteer

Follow structure - but make it in a cohesive paper: State of the art...

- do we want to amend the proposed structure? – no, it is a good structure
- do we all follow the same structure? - yes

2. General guidelines:

- a. number of words (pages) – not set for the COST document; will follow for the book, but roughly between 8000-12000
- b. what will we do with it? – Book chapters in the end

3. Deadlines

For COST document - sub WGs will send final draft by February 15 (with a narrative-argumentative format, no bullet points or entry); Management team will provide a final document by February 29

For book - need to propose a calendar once the Editors are decided, but we need to have in mind a 2years final deadline so we could budget open-access within COST

Final draft of the Glossary:

1. General guidelines

- a. number of words (200-300 per entry)

Start of Working session 2 here

- b. 3-5 references at the end of the entry (no in text references unless absolutely needed; avoid direct citations)
- c. number of entries per subWG (not important - everything will be merged)
- d. structure - Gabriella proposed one, but too complicated for a 200-300 words entry; stick with definitions and key aspects

We will not have a hierarchical structure of the entries (with “major” and “minor” types of entries), but a networked-like structure, with entries referencing other entries.

Tasks and deadlines:

1. LITERATURE REVIEW

Document to be submitted to COST:

- Subgroup leaders - send final document to the Management team (Agnieszka, Nicoleta, Carlos) by February 15th;
 - narrative-argumentative format
 - respect the structure agreed upon (Definitions, Types and Typologies, Expressions of opinions, Methods, Any other relevant issues (if anything))
 - no number of page limit
 - feel free to cut things out, but keep them for future use in a different document
 - APA 7th edition format
 - cross-reference entries, when appropriate
 - the audience you should have in mind - an academic, but non-specialized, audience

Management team send final *final* document to project leader (Christian) by February 29th

Projected book

- Management team calls for volunteers (pitches) for Editor(s) of a book along with a general 1-page outline (schematic logic) of the book by February 29th
- Management team calls for people who have direct connections to prestigious academic publishers (if any) to notify us about this connection - we could use a direct line when sending a proposal; we do not expect anything else than facilitating connection - by February 29th

- Editors will prepare a clear logical outline of the book and a “call for chapters” by April 30th (will report about it in Salamanca)
- Working papers

2. GLOSSARY

- subgroup leaders – send final document with entries respecting the commonly agreed “rules” of writing entries to the Management team by February 15th
 - 200-300 words per entry
 - No in-text references unless absolutely needed
 - Final list of 3-5 references (not counted in the number of words) – APA 7th edition format
 - Limited quotes in the entries (only if really necessary; prefer rephrases)
 - More than one perspective to one entry if necessary (probably after revisions cross-subWGs)
 - Management team will assign a list of entries to be assigned to reviewers within each subWGs by February 29th
- Management team expects reviewed entries by two reviewers with “accepted”, “modified by....” or “alternative definition provided by...” by March 20st – need confirmation from each subWGs that people confirmed they will revise
- Management team sends back the revised items to the subWGs leaders by March 25th
- **Management team will prepare a final draft for the document to be sent to Cost by April 1st (still a working paper)**
- SubWGs leaders send final version of their list of entries to the Management team by April 30th
- Management team will pitch the idea of a small group who would like to work on a proper publishable Glossary or Key concepts or any other form (volunteers who would like to take this further are very welcome)

Day 2 - 19.01.2024

Session 3

People were divided into 4 groups (subgroups) and worked on internal issues related to the upcoming deadlines and activities to be completed.

Team5 project open and accepting people (please email Aleksandra) – They want to identify politicians active on at least 2 platforms; write them emails; scrap the data; manual coding (topic: migration; posts + comments). Detailed minutes regarding progress from Limassol session available from Aleksandra upon request.

Subgroup Political communication and cultural studies set details, tasks, and people responsible about the upcoming deadlines

Session 4

Discussion about the glossary:

Types of entries:

More academic, see for example "Discourse", or more in line with the newly agreed rules - see "emotion display norms".

We agreed that the entry "emotion display norms" (see below) could be taken as an example of style, format, way of structuring the entry:

Emotion display norms

Emotion display norms refer to the socially accepted and expected ways in which individuals express and manage their emotions in a given culture or society. These norms dictate how people should outwardly display their feelings, whether it be happiness, sadness, anger, or other emotions, in various social situations. The regulation is usually internalized by the individuals and people act accordingly.

Cultural, societal, and situational factors influence emotion expressions. Different cultures may have distinct expectations regarding the appropriateness and intensity of emotional expressions. For example, some cultures may encourage open displays of emotion, while others may emphasize restraint and a more subdued expression of feelings.

Additionally, emotion display norms can vary depending on the context or setting. What is considered acceptable behavior in a formal situation (i.e. workplaces, streets, public events) might differ significantly from what is acceptable among friends or family members.

Gender and related stereotypes can also influence emotion display norms. Societal expectations regarding how men and women should express emotions may impact how the speakers' messages are perceived. Females, for example, may face challenges related to stereotypes about displaying emotion, with a fine line between being seen as empathic or authentic and being labeled as overly emotional. Males may be easily labeled weak or unprofessional when manifesting feelings and using emotive phrases. Understanding and adhering to emotion display norms is crucial for effective social interaction and communication, as deviations from these norms may be perceived as inappropriate or disruptive in a given cultural or social context.

The long discussion about the Glossary yielded the following ideas:

1. The project to create a publishable Glossary that people would want to recommend and make open to anybody looks more ambitious than previously thought, in the sense that:
 - Many entries need serious work by qualified people in each field to make sure they accurately represent the state of art;
 - We need serious criteria of inclusion and exclusion of terms, which could be achieved in at least two different ways: inductively, by mapping and connecting the existing terms and see which terms should further connect to other terms, which are now part of the respective entry; deductively, coming up with argumentized inclusion/exclusion criteria
2. We proposed the idea of a smaller group (volunteer based, so please reach out if you are interested) of people, who would like to get this idea further and to make it into something meaningful (online ISBN document, Wiki network, Key concepts in Opinion studies book, etc.) - we need leadership on this.
3. We could link this to WG3 database (Meteor project)

6 WG SESSIONS: WG2 TOOLS

Day 1 - 18.01.2024

Deliverables: we decided to focus on:

- Putting things on Meteor (Fabienne and Hajo, pleaaaaase ;-))
- Working towards theory section in our paper (even if paper is incomplete b/c coding is not finished)

Theory and definition of OPINIONS

- There has been a paper published by some member of WG1 (<https://dx.doi.org/10.1515/lpp-2023-0022/html>) from a linguistic perspective
- While they do not use exactly the same definition like we do in our paper draft (https://docs.google.com/document/d/1oehXpMwZ2wBbaeCq-WHk7Qyt5E_EgZp6sXvQ90FfnVg/edit#heading=h.6f7evpaeidk2), we concluded that the definitions are compatible (they contain similar elements, especially also the target). They also emphasize cultural context dependency, but that's not a major issue for us
- At the same time, what they did empirically (training word embeddings) doesn't really fit what we envision

Drafting the paper:

- We continued to work on the paper draft
- We now have a zotero group library set up by Daniel (-> send him request to join): https://www.zotero.org/groups/5360247/opinion_wg2_litrev

Joint session with WG1:

At a joint session with WG1 in the afternoon, Nicoleta Corbu promised to send us a list of references that we (Damian) can use to back up our definition(s) in the theory section of our paper.

- WG1 collects different definitions, but hasn't converged on one. At the same time, they see no issue with ours.
- WG1 also invited members of WG2 to contribute to a glossary of terms related to measurement of opinions; they'll come back to us. They'll also invite us to write a book chapter on opinions

Abstract annotation task:

- The subgroup working on the annotation of abstracts will code another round of n=50 abstracts for a reliability test until 24 Jan 2024 and will meet again on 29 Jan 2024
- The procedure to parallel-code the abstracts by 3 coders has been approved by the WG2 members present at the Limassol meeting
- The abstract coding team at this point includes: Roksana Gloc, Valerie Hase, Sjoerd Stolwijk, Daniel Thiele, Samia Touileb, and Aleksandra Urman. Kasper Welbers and Nelda Kote both also joined in Limassol.

Paper annotation task: (see Day 2)

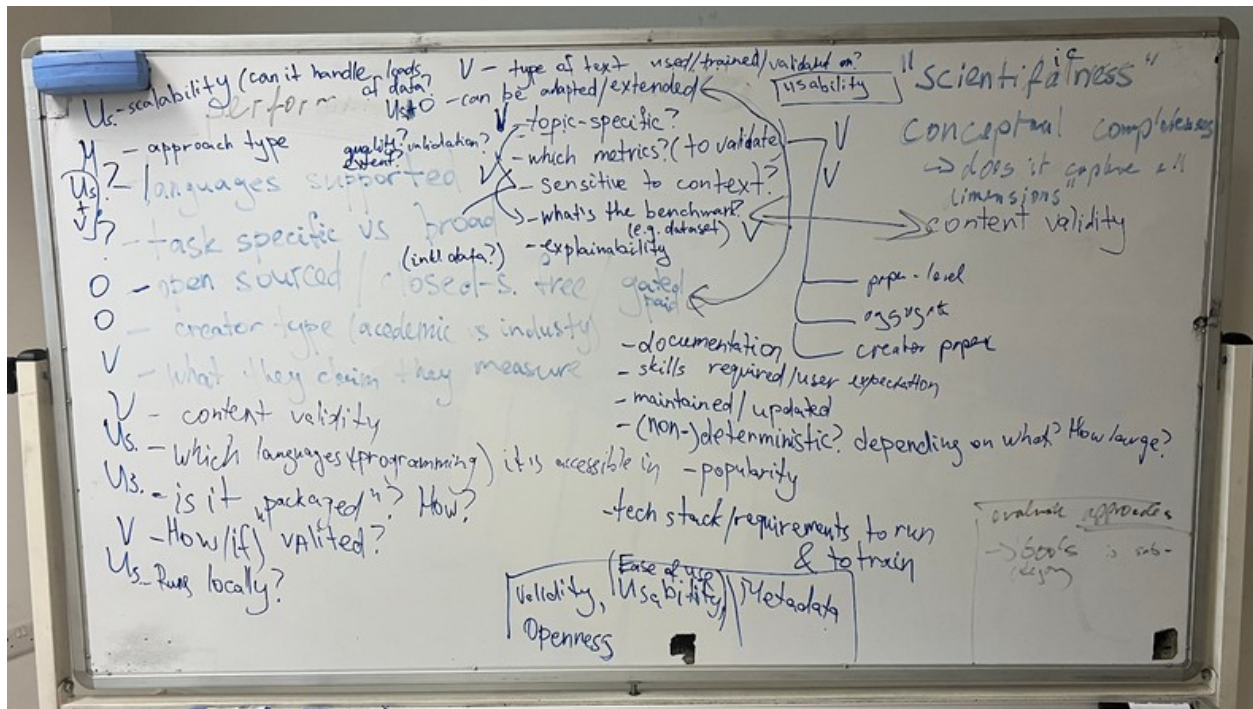
Friendly takeover of WG3 (?)

- WG3 has problems in terms of having a sustainable team; at the same time, some of their immediate tasks (annotate papers for datasets) can be integrated to ours
- We offered to WG3 members to join our Slack Groups (e.g., #wg2-general) to participate in our coding efforts. We cannot incorporate their whole detailed codebook (that's sth for later, and for them), but we can code datasets as long as WG3 sends some annotators over ;-)

Criteria for evaluating tools

- For the stage after doing the full paper lit review, we will carefully evaluate the tools
- We made a "crazy board" brainstorming all things that might be relevant for tool evaluation (see Figure 1 below). Those will need to be grouped and filtered out but we can do this at a later stage, so far we converged on Validity, Ease of Use (aka usability) and Openness as 3 categories to group the criteria but these are far from being set in stone. An additional category = Metadata.
- Damian will try to make a first write-up of this

Day 2 - 19.01.2024

Full paper annotation

- Developed codebook further:

- Now 10 questions about tools, data, approach and specific understanding of opinions
- The full paper annotation is the second steps of a 3 parts coding for the datasets we are producing for our paper (step 1, which papers are measuring human opinions aka abstract annotation; step 2, which tools, data and understanding of opinion is mentioned in papers identified in step 1 aka paper annotation; step 3, how good are the tools that are currently used to measure human opinion (i.e how do they score in terms of validity, ease of use and openness?) aka tool annotation)
- We reviewed two papers in the group and iteratively improved and completed the codebook: <https://doi.org/10.35940/ijrte.B1453.0982S1119> and <https://doi.org/10.18653/v1/2020.emnlp-main.288>

Some notable discussions:

- Is a model that is developed in a paper a tool if the authors include code to run it for opinion classification? Pro: others can use it as a tool, even if the authors do not understand or distribute it as a tool. Con: it does not have a name and technically does not fit the requirement that tools need to be a combination of “linguistic resources (such as dictionaries, human annotated material and transfer learning models), text processing steps (such as tokenization of text, embedding, counting word frequencies and creating co-occurrence matrices), and algorithms of other decision heuristics” (paper draft).
- Q7 and Q8 were added during the discussion. We need to think whether they capture the understanding of opinion employed in a paper
- We also fed the codebook to ChatGPT and made it annotate the two papers we manually reviewed. The agreement was 100%. We are thus hopeful that we can automatically annotate the full papers. Notably, this did not work for step 1.

The next steps:

- Clean up the codebook (grammar, numbering etc.) and add some coding instructions and examples
- recruit coders from WG2+3
- Perform a coder training
- Annotate a validation set to establish that ChatGPT is doing the correct thing
- Collect the remaining papers annotated as relevant and feed them to ChatGPT or an open generative large language model (if we have validation data, we can easily establish if they give valid answers and not give money and data to ‘Open’AI)

Other efforts:

- One subgroup participated in the work of “Team 5” (part of WG1 + part of WG2). The main research question of that meeting is: to which extent platforms used to express opinions impact the opinions. For example, the group of persons might become more polarised on one social network than on another, even when discussing the same topic. We want to measure this phenomenon. The challenges include scraping limitations, GDPR, privacy, the availability of COST members to work on this, coordination between WG1 and WG2.

Summary of action items

- We agreed to start working on the paper itself. Even if the main part of the paper will be filled in once we have the list of the tools, we can already start working on the other parts. This includes the methodology section, which contains the definitions, instructions etc.

7 WG SESSIONS: WG3 DATA & APPLICATION

The sessions of WG3 were dissolved, owing to the disproportionate share of last-minute cancellations that affected this WG, and the present members joined other WG sessions.

The coordination of this between the teachers is a task taken up by Ana Milojevic — helped by Carlos Arcilla Caldron, Mariken Van Der Velden. One week in advance, we have all info on the Cost Opinion Website. All teaching materials are open source and hyperlinked on the website. Evaluation of COpA is created by David Blanco-Herrero

- Interviews for academic paper to complement the survey: Computational Literacy of Opinion Researchers across Europe

The paper explores the computational literacy level of opinion researchers across Europe based on individual differences like as: age, gender and experience. Computational literacy, in this context, would refer to the ability of researchers to use and understand computational tools and methods in their work. The paper will assess the proficiency of opinion researchers in using computational tools and techniques, including programming languages as: Python, R etc. It will discuss challenges and barriers faced by opinion researchers in adopting computational methods based on diverse context and their training needs. Building on this discussion, the unified theory of acceptance and use of technology will be used as a theoretical basis to propose individual characteristics, technology characteristics that can contribute to the adoption literature which can help and positively influence to the opinion researchers to use technology tools.

Methodology: Gathering data through surveys to the opinion researchers that will participate to training school before and after it; Interviewing six people (two seniors, two lecturers, two professors, men and women) per six countries based on their development approach and geographic position to understand the current computational skills, practices, and challenges faced by opinion researchers.

Literature Review: Examining existing literature on computational literacy and its role in opinion analysis research

- Papers based on using LLMs (gpt4):

The first one can be centered around evaluating GPT 4 as a text analysis tool. Every participant would need to create an analysis (see this example), run it and then evaluate it (and ask two other colleagues to evaluate it as well). If this is done by 30 participants with different analyses we could come out with very accurate evaluations of GPT 4 as a text analysis tool.

The second thing could be administering 30 different surveys to different language models (gpt-4, mistral-7b-instruct, llama-2-70b-chat, gpt-3.5-turbo, pplx-70b-chat, mixtral-8x7b-instruct and Bard) on 3 consecutive days to detect differences in

sentiment of language models and to see how stable they are in expressing the sentiment towards the same issue on different days. The example of my analysis is attached (this is analysis done on one topic). The goal is creating a benchmark in testing and alignment of AI.

e. Policy Output

- What is output of network, can we make impact with these outputs?
- Something important to keep in mind for 2025 and following years!
- Adapting publications out of COS:

Article to be sent to The Conversation in the frame of the Elections to the European Parliament. This could have a tentative title similar to “Changing opinion in crisis conditions”. It would focus on how relevant the study of opinion is in relation to the European Elections, which are defining for Eastern Europe, which are threatened by the rise of far-right populist parties, and which take place under the influence of the war in Ukraine. It will give voice to different members of the consortium as experts in the topic, with attention to German, Balkan or other colleagues from different regions. It is expected to be submitted during March 2024, possibly using the Portuguese elections as a news hook. It will be led by David Blanco-Herrero, Bruno Ferreira Costa and Serghei Sprincean.

Article to be sent to The Conversation about the generation of opinions in social media. It will explore, among other aspects, the way youngsters consume politics in social media, to a great extent via humor and memes. A premise of the article is the fact that a very well trained and educated generation (the most certified generation) is nonetheless very vulnerable to misinformation and populism. It will be led by Mariken van der Velden, Dana Guy and Ana Milojevic. It is expected to be submitted no sooner than March 2024.

Report with pros and cons about the use of social media analysis for opinion research. This is expected to be a larger report, maybe produced as a policy brief, aimed at civil society organizations (although potentially open to other stakeholders). Specific tips and methods are expected to be discussed. This product is expected to be published during the last quarter of 2024 (already the next year of the Cost action). The production of this output will start with a writing session during the consortium meeting in Salamanca in June 2024.
